UPDATES FROM ANZ + SPAIN



We are well and truly under way in ANZ + Spain, recruiting ~600 patients onto CARSK since late 2016. We are also busy datagathering for clinical events committee (CEC), led by Miss Bree Shi (data manager for CARSK ANZ + Spain) and Dr Chuck Herzog (chair, CEC). The Australian investigators recently met at the ISN World Congress of Nephrology in Melbourne to share experiences of the trial.

We are committed to recruiting more patients for CARSK in 2020! Meanwhile, we are hoping to bring 2 more sites on board within the next 3 months (**Perth** and **Darwin**), rounding our total active sites to 13.

Looking forward to meeting and working with everyone as the trial evolves.


